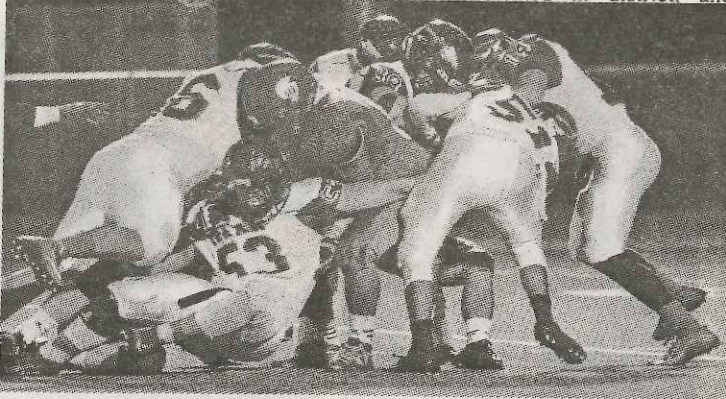
The second quarter was a much different story. The Braves went on a roll and racked

up 19 more points and the Hornets with only one more touchdown.

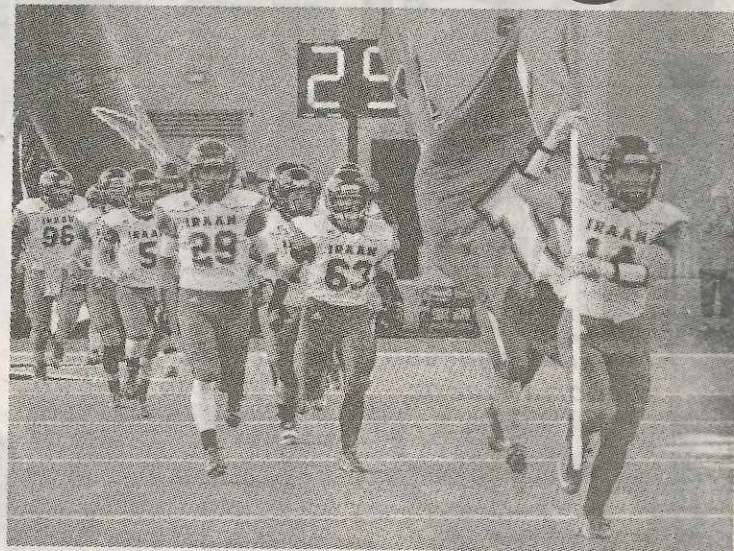
