The McDonald's Texas Invitational is a prestigious tournament reserved for the top 48 teams in the state. On Thursday, they played two games against South Houston HS and Fort Bend Marshall HS, winning both games to place them into the gold division, the top tier in the competition. Head coach Justin Reese believes that this year's team will be able to replicate the success of last year's district championship winning team, especially considering the team's strong performance in the McDonald's Texas Invitational.


