HOW DOES IT FEEL TO BE A FRESHMAN ON A STATE WINNING TEAM?

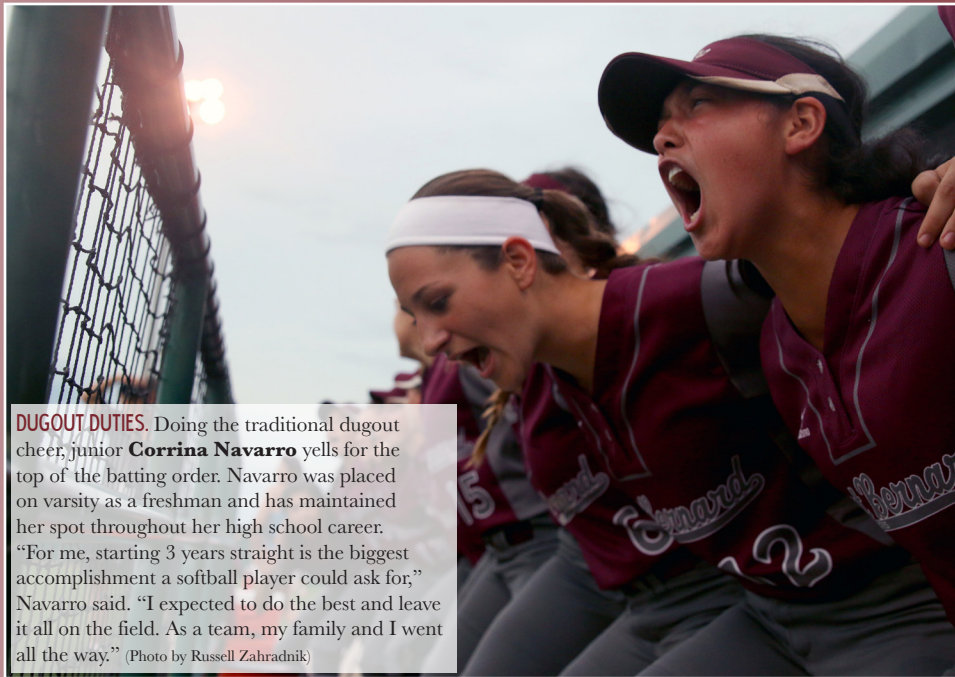
