Believing They Can

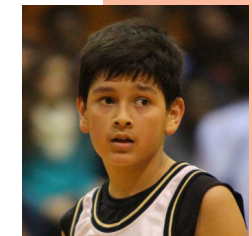
the sweet smell of success

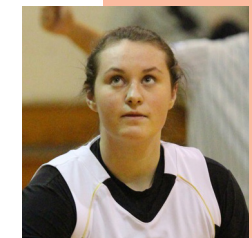
