

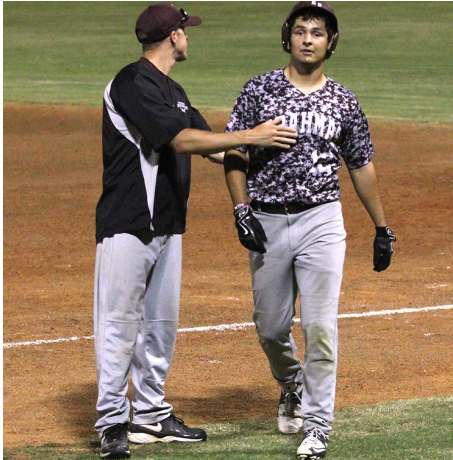
ON THE BALL
