**FROZEN FUN**

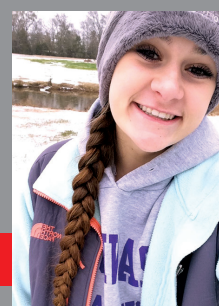
