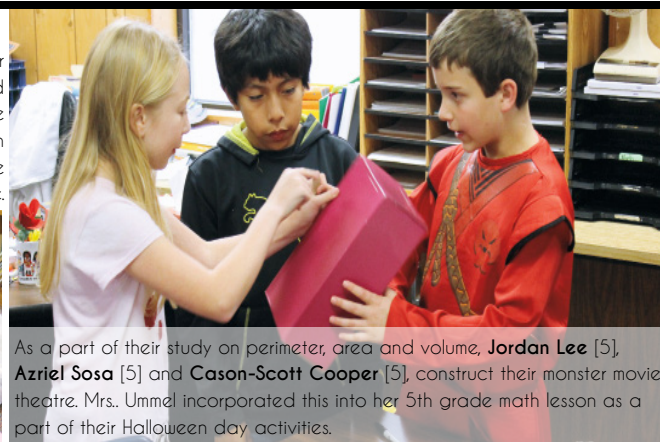
Fall Festivities
