WHAT IS YOUR FAVORITE WHAT IS THE WORST MEMORY FROM THE SEASON? WORKOUT?



WHAT WAS THE BEST PART OF BEING ON THE TEAM?


"We all got along pretty well. We started out independent, but we ended up working together as a team and had so much fun," junior Melissa Fajkus said.
