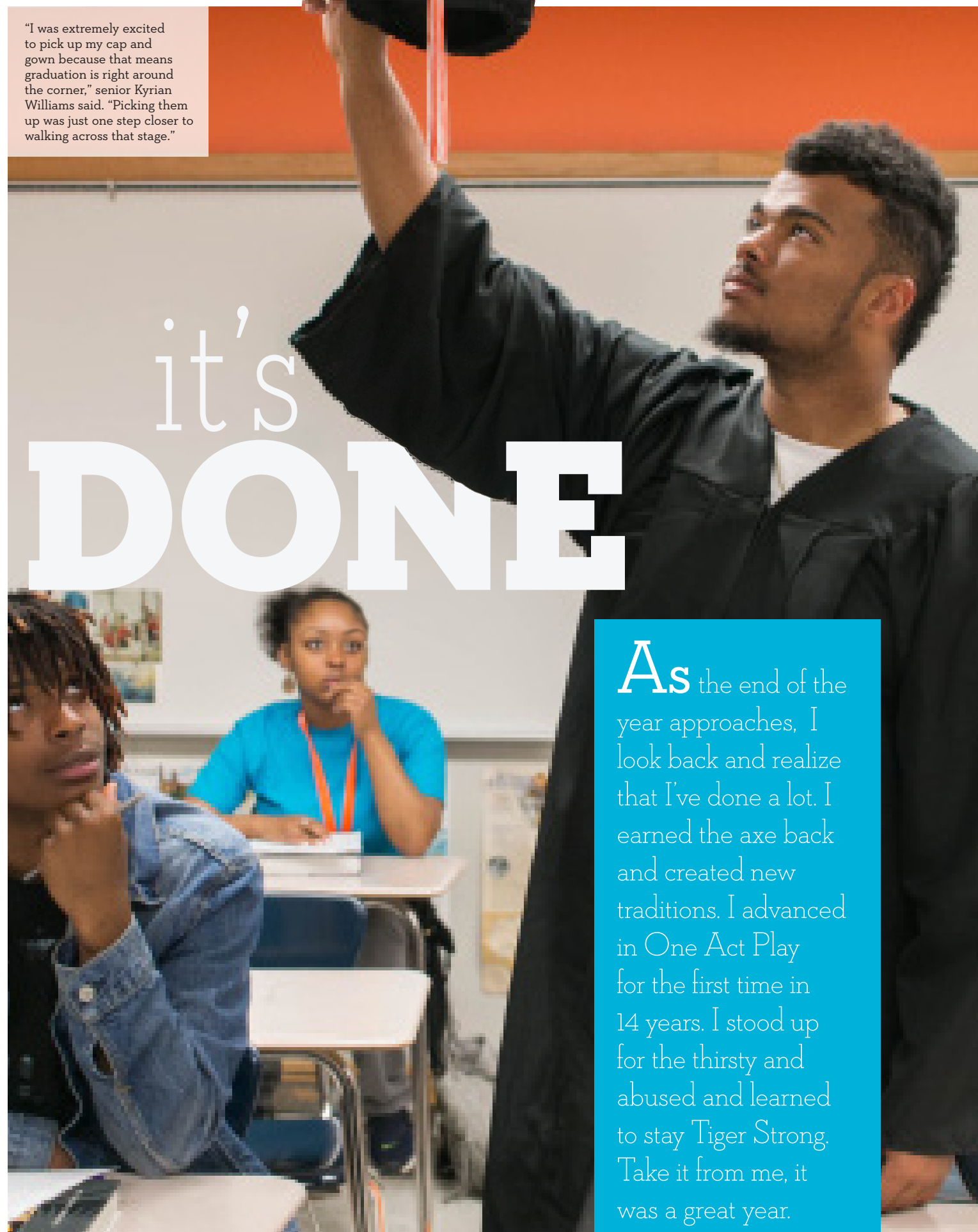
4 seasons
