



Despite the season falling short for the Lady Dogs in the third round of the playoffs, it was just as successful as they expected, if not more. Overcoming many challenges, the girls had a streak of nine consecutive wins in district.

The girls swept the district, which consisisted of Tatum, Rusk and Henderson. With the help of stat leaders Alli Capps11, Kaitlyn Nutt11, Faith Landrenaux11 and Kenzie Templeton¹², no challenge was ever too big.

'Henderson was our biggest challenge in keeping this streak," head coach Leven Barker said. "The girls played hard and consistent.'

As setter, Templeton led the team in assists with a record of 857 this season. Outside hitter, Capps, was named District MVP and led her team with 372 kills.

"I am proud of our team for pulling through the tough games and working hard to keep our streak," Capps said. "I just let our record push us harder."

Although she had a season-ending injury, Landreneaux led the team with 145 blocks and followed Capps with a stat record of 265 kills. Nutt, the libero, Nutt was named District Defensive MVP and held the team's stat record of 556 digs.

"Faith was a big part of our team and in the middle of our season she got hurt," Nutt said. "As a team, it was our responsibility to step it up, and we did."

Being undefeated in district, the Lady Dogs came out with first place in District 19-4A.

"To win as many games as we have in a row, you have to have consistency and dig down when games get tight," Barker said. "Our kids did that."
